Dynamic In-Person Opportunities

Regional Meetups are hosted by families around the world, in addition to the schoolsponsored StartUp! at the beginning of the year. Graduation Weekend is held over three days on Stanford University's campus, including prom, school-wide awards, and our graduation ceremony. Summer @ Stanford offers two weeks at Stanford University where students connect inperson, live on campus, and engage in an enriching academic program. Pixel Festival and Splash! are held annually on different coasts and include events like homecoming, flag football, and the winter formal dance.

Schedule & Enrollment



Flexible Enrollment

Stanford OHS meets each student's goals with three enrollment options: full-time, part-time, or single course. Students can attend Stanford OHS as their only school or as a way to supplement their learning with courses not typically found in secondary schools. Access to academic advising, clubs, and events is available to students in all enrollment levels. To graduate from Stanford OHS with a high school diploma, students must be enrolled full-time in their final two years of high school. Additionally, they must complete a minimum number of Stanford OHS courses, and requirements by subject area.






Expect the Extraordinary

How It Works

Stanford OHS courses, averaging 12 students per class, can be accessed from anywhere across the globe. In this dynamic online setting that goes beyond the capabilities of brick-and-mortar schools, instructors and students meet and engage in live discussions.

Our video conferencing platform enables students to see and speak with classmates and teachers during class seminars. Students prepare for discussion seminars by watching recorded lectures, reading texts, working through math problem sets, or conducting an at-home lab assignment. These preparatory activities require students to develop independence and self-discipline. Our instructional model helps students to deepen their understanding of course materials. During class, students actively participate by sharing ideas and questions with instructors and peers, annotating onscreen materials, and collaborating in small groups.
